Challenge Gift Points Toward A Bright "Future of the Faith"

The campaign to make certain our Midway Christian building is in good shape has simmered for years. It has now taken concrete shape. With one extraordinary gift (given anonymously), the church has made a giant step toward our minimum \$255,000 goal. This gift will be \$50,000 to begin with. Then a second and a third \$50,000 will be given to match our donations, dollar for dollar (total matching funds \$100,000).

The effort has been spearheaded by Bob Rouse and committee, including John Batts, Phil Burchell, Jim Hoppin, Jim McDaniel, Jack Morgan, Dan Roller, Bob Settlemire, Jeanne Sturgill, and others.

Areas included are: paying off the debt for Fellowship Hall heating/ac unit (\$60,000), replacing ancient heating/ac for sanctuary and basement (\$55,000), modernizing sanctuary electrical system (\$5,000), repairing exterior brick work (\$80,000), replacing/painting cornices and window casings (\$45,000) and improving front entrance (\$10,000). Total cost is \$255,000.

Some members—prior to the one generous gift—have been most creative, including: Jim Leer—cooking up a post-worship dinner that created several hundred dollars; Amy Perry and Anne Burford have spearheaded the Midway Treasures Auction, set for July 15; Jeannie Hill has offered to perform landscape work; Ouita Michel is reheating a proven recipe for success—the menu from the Thanksgiving Market.

Everyone's gift will count toward meeting the magnificent challenge. What is most important is that each person who is part of the community of Midway Christian Church examine him or herself to determine how you will be part of this great endeavor.

This is our shared future—the Future of the Faith!

WHAT TO EXPECT

- - - *Robert S. Stauffer*

I've often felt we should talk about what you might expect from a minister. I write this, of course, as you are nearing the end of your interim period, and anticipate a new "settled pastor" and a new era in the life of Midway Christian Church. (Many thanks, in part, to Linda McKiernan-Allen, a faithful Interim Pastor, for ideas expressed here.)

Ministry in the Christian Church is very definitely a "general" vocation...one in which creative planning, visitation, building relationships, and promotion are all part of daily life. It includes meeting with people in a wide diversity of venues, dealing with people in times of laughter and joy, as well as in times of sickness and loss of life.

What is it you can reasonably expect of your minister? A) You can expect a minister **to be with you through the tough times and the high moments**. Of course, a significant part of this involves making sure the pastor knows about these moments. It is important—really important—to let your pastor know about upcoming surgery or hospitalizations, or any desire to get better acquainted. I continue to be in the office late mornings and in the afternoons, Monday through Thursday.

B) **Encouragement**—You can expect a pastor will eagerly **encourage your growth in the faith**, through engagement in small groups, through worship leadership and preparation.

C) **Challenge**—You can expect your pastor **to challenge you**—through **sermons**, through workshops and articles, through urging your participation in **retreats and camps**.

D) You can also expect your minister to

pray with you and for you. It is important to me, to continue praying for each one of you...as I trust you do for your brothers and sisters in church life.

What do you expect from a minister?

Thanks to all who contributed to the kids in Haiti. The shoes and socks and other great treats were well received by the 28 kids that you helped.

My trip was wonderful. We finished up a VBS that another team had started. It is amazing that these kids are so strong for the Lord. They couldn't wait for the time to start the morning singing, praying and loving God.

The kids are happy and healthy. Their recent move from Croix de Bouquet, to the mountainous area of Ft. Jacques has been a great change. The city was much hotter and more dangerous. The mountainous home is much cooler and the kids have less stress. They still live, eat, play, have school and church all in one area but they are secure. Sometimes Debbie takes them into town with her but otherwise they stay in the house and surrounding area. They do have an area to play soccer, which they enjoy. We taught them to play t-ball, which they hadn't played before. At first, the language barrier was somewhat difficult, they speak French-Creole, we didn't. But after showing them how to play, we ended up playing for two hours.

Life in Haiti is harsh but the love of God that shines in these people is amazing. We had a church service in Balan, a small village in the desert area of Haiti, I was most impressed with there offering, these people who live in mud huts and miles to go to make money, gave freely. This impressed me in the fact that we can place an offering in the tray without thinking about it, but these people work for there coins. God blesses all who give to him and his children.
