Stewardship of Creation

History of the Alverna Covenant

The Alverna Covenant was written by members of the Task Force on Christian Lifestyle and Ecology of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) while meeting at Alverna Retreat Center, a Franciscan retreat in Indianapolis, Ind. The name has added significance. Alverna is named for Mt. Alverna in Italy, the mountain retreat given to Francis of Assisi. Francis is honored for his concern for the care of and relatedness of all creation. The 800th anniversary of Francis' birth was celebrated in 1981, the year the Alverna Covenant was first introduced at the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

The Alverna Covenant

Whereas:

- God has created the world with finite resources;
- God has given to us the stewardship of the earth;
- God has established order through many natural cycles.

And it is evident that:

- We are consuming resources at a rate that cannot be maintained;
- We are interrupting many natural cycles;
- We are irresponsibly modifying the environment through consumption and pollution;
- We are populating the earth at a rate that cannot be maintained;

As a member of the human family and a follower of Jesus Christ, I hereby covenant that:

- I will change my lifestyle to reduce my contribution to pollution;
- I will support recycling efforts;
- I will search for sustainable lifestyles;
- I will work for public policies which lead to a just and sustainable society;
- I will share these concerns with others and urge them to make this Covenant.

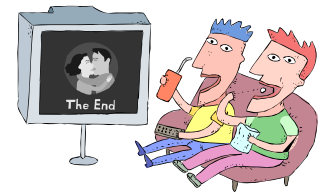
Greetings Parents and Youth!

Christmount Initiative Will Use Donations For Relief Program

Disciples who visit Christmount next year will have a chance to bring along items that will either help the medically underserved abroad or those who are hungry in this country. The Christmount Board of Directors has announced a new outreach initiative that will apply to Disciples who spend time in retreat or other activities at Christmount, the camp and conference center for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

For the overseas mission projects, Disciples are being asked to bring gauze pads, children medicines or tape to include in the International Medical Assistance (IMA) medicine boxes. The donated materials will be assembled during events at the center beginning in January. The items will be dedicated and sent to Week of Compassion's partner agency, IMA World Health for distribution.

Disciples also can participate in the outreach activities by bringing food for the local ecumenical crisis ministry, Swannanoa Valley Christian Ministry. Lexington Theological Seminary to Reinvent in Face of Economic Turmoil

Trustees of Lexington Theological Seminary have declared the school is in a state of financial emergency and will use this as an opportunity to boldly reinvent itself by developing a curriculum that stresses effective parish ministry as its primary focus.

While these changes are very painful in the short term, LTS President James P. Johnson said the Seminary will focus on creating a new curriculum that will better prepare divinity students for careers as parish pastors. Faculty will develop courses that will merge theological thinking with practical skills in such areas as money management, use of technology and conflict resolution. Many course offerings will be available online and taught at remote locations.

The school's financial situation has been compounded by "a tsunami of economic disasters that we have not seen in our lifetimes," Johnson told trustees. An endowment that once stood at about \$25 million in July 2007 is about \$16 million today, Johnson said.

Johnson said the Seminary's \$4 million budget will be cut, meaning reducing faculty and staff positions.

Steve Monhollen, faculty representative to the trustees, said faculty learned of the pending decisions several weeks ago and have already begun discussing ways to redesign and enhance the curriculum and the learning process. "The faculty has been energized by the possibilities of being on the forefront of a totally new seminary curriculum."

"The Seminary will look different, act differently and be better positioned to serve students and congregations when we come out of this," Johnson said.

The Seminary continues to meet all its financial obligations, Johnson said; however, the draw on the endowment must be reduced immediately, forcing the staff cuts. It costs LTS \$10,000 per year in tuition to educate a master of divinity student; almost all master of divinity students receive scholarships for tuition, only having to pay outright for room and board.
