

Member Spotlight: Phil and Nancy Dare

Having grown up together in a St. Louis suburb, Nancy and Phil's wedding in 1960 was embraced by church folks there as a Tom Thumb wedding. Raised in the Disciples of Christ tradition they never strayed far from the fold. Phil graduated from Phillips University in Enid, Oklahoma. Nancy attended Tulsa University for one year, then Phillips before following her heartthrob to Kentucky where she finished her degree at the University of Kentucky while Phil got a degree at the College of the Bible. Phil then taught part-time at Midway Junior College.



Nancy remained the breadwinner of the family working in various departments at UK while Phil continued collecting knowledge there. They left Lexington for a few years to teach in the Peace Corps in Malaysia. Returning to Lexington, they picked up where they left off; Nancy employed and Phil watching professors write on the chalkboard, all of which eventually qualified him to be the housemother in the football dorm at Eastern Kentucky University. After three years of that experience, Phil returned to UK for the Library Science degree, which led to employment in the Margaret I. King Library and eventually the seminary library at Lexington Theological Seminary.

Meanwhile, Nancy was maintaining her sanity serving on the boards of Habitat for Humanity, the International Hospitality program at UK, raising two girls, Stephanie and Samantha, and singing in the Crestwood Christian Church choir.

Ever since the sixties the Dares had connections as well as warm feelings with Midway, finally moving over here in the summer of 2006 with Roberta, Phil's sister; Ruth, Nancy's mother, and Alexandra, the Dare's granddaughter. So far there haven't been any petitions to have them relocate. Instead, everyone has welcomed them with open arms and cheerful smiles, for which the Dares are deeply grateful.

It's summertime! This school year has gone by so fast! Summertime brings warmer weather, lazy afternoons and dips in the pool! Summer time also brings a few changes here at the church. One of these changes is that Youth group will be meeting once a month, in the afternoon on Wednesdays! This change is an attempt at offering families the weekends to travel and visit with friends.

On Wednesday, June 17th the children and youth will be meeting at 11:30am at the church. We will be heading to Champs in Lexington. For those of you who haven't been to Champs before they offer a variety of entertainment experiences. There is roller skating, laser tag and arcade! The cost per person is \$5 plus an additional \$2.50 for skate rental. The cost for Laser Tag is \$5 per game (I figure we'll get in about 2 games. However, there is a height limit of 3 feet for Laser Tag. Those who are not tall enough or do not want to do laser tag can continue to skate or play arcade games and an adult will stay with them. On Wednesday, July 21st the children and youth will be meeting at 11:30am and will return around 4:30pm at the church to head to the Lexington Ice Center! The cost for bible mini golf is \$5.75 for those 10 and under and \$7.00 for those 11 and over. We will be eating at the ice center so please bring a non perishable sack lunch with you! The Lexington Ice Center requires that we have the fees gathered before arrival so I ask that you turn in your money no later than the Sunday before, July 19th! Adult volunteers are needed to help transport and supervise!

It is estimated that the meal for the average American travels about 1500 miles from the farm where it was grown to the plate!! During this "trip", gasoline is used to transport the foods, nutrients and freshness fade and the consumer has little knowledge of the source of the food.

Locally raised and produced food is better tasting, better for the environment, better for the local economy and better for our health. When we use locally grown foods, either in our own kitchens or by eating at local restaurants that use local foods, we support the local economy which often includes our friends and neighbors.

In the Midway area, we have several opportunities to buy local food and produce for our use, in addition to the wonderful restaurants who use these products. The **Woodford County Farmers Market** is open in Versailles Wednesdays 3pm-6pm on Green Street (behind the Presbyterian Church) and Saturdays 8am-1pm on Courthouse Square. **Susie Quick of "Honest Farm"** plans to have a market here in Midway with local vegetables and fruits, along with homemade breads, desserts, etc. **Weisenberger Mill** has produced quality flours and baking products since 1865, and continues to provide the freshest products around. **Boyd Orchard** south of Versailles and **Evans Orchard** near Georgetown have a variety of fruits and other produce raised on their farms. Other markets include those in Lexington and Frankfort.

Enjoy exploring the bounty of fresh foods near you, meeting the people who grow or produce it and supporting the local economy!!
