A Pastoral Word

We have started a new church year and we find ourselves at an interesting crossroads. There have been many questions about what we are going to do for our next Student Associate and who we are going to get to come in. And the answer is I don't know. I don't know because the way we used to do things is changing. As of Fall 2010, LTS will be a strictly on-line seminary and this will change the availability of student associate ministers.

And we find ourselves in strange new territory, very much like the first believers who experienced the empty tomb on that first Easter morning. Things are different. And now we are faced with a challenge: Will we have the courage to adapt to these changes? Will we have the willingness to step out of our comfort zones? Will we listen to where the voice of God is calling us?

So what does this mean for Midway Christian Church? It means that we can't function like we've always functioned in the past. It means that I can't do everything. It means that we as a church need to really figure out where God is calling us and how we can/will live out our mission of WELCOME as part of the Body of Christ here on earth

One of our basic beliefs and practices is that we are all called to ministers. We embraced this call when we emerged from our baptismal waters. We embraced this call the first time we experienced God's changing and life-giving love. I see that God has laid before us an opportunity, an opportunity to think outside of the box. How are we going to actively work to share the Good News? Green Chalice Ministry Team

Our Rain Garden is coming right along and we need your help. We are in need of native plants for our rain garden. Why native plants? "Native Plants are ideal for landscaping for many reasons. Because they have adapted Kentucky's climate over millions of years, , they don't need chemicals to help them grow, they can tolerate our cold winters and hot summers winter, they have very deep roots which allow them to be more drought resistant, they have developed defenses against harmful native insects, and can serve as habitats for native wildlife (consider planting for butterflies, hummingbirds, or songbirds!). The deep roots of native plants also makes them ideal for rain gardens because they create channels in the soil which allow water to soak in quickly." (www.bluegrassraingardenalliance.org). We are in need of : Purple Coneflower, Black Eyed Susan, Blue Indigo, Bee Balm, Spiked Blazing Star, Silky Aster, and Wild Bergamot.



The other exciting news that is happening with our Green Chalice Team is that the Board approved a motion at its June 6th meeting to adopt the practices set forth by the Alverna Covenant to become a "green" congregation and made a motion that was approved by the congregation at our congregational meeting on June 20th that affirms that Midway Christian Church will live out the Alverna Covenant in our practices. We are already doing many of the things needed to be a green congregation such as recycling, using programmable thermostats in our church buildings as well as the church parsonage, our new rain garden, and providing educational opportunities like our Summer Series.
