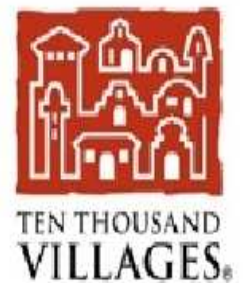

### Special Community Worship Service of Peace and Hope

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the September 11th attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon. The Midway Area Ministerial Association will be hosting a special community worship service on Sunday September 11th at 11 a.m. at Walter Bradley Park to remember this solemn occasion and to call each of us as people of faith to come together as one Body of Christ, working towards peace, hope and unity. *This will be Midway Christian Church worship service for the morning. We will not have regularly scheduled worship at our building that day.*

Following the service, everyone is invited to stay and celebrate a meal together as the Midway Community, reminding us that we are all welcomed at God's table as God's beloved children. Just think about it! Everyone sitting beside one another and really getting to know each other as neighbors and friends we just haven't met yet, all the while, strengthening the bonds of community. As part of this celebration meal, everyone is asked to bring a side dish or dessert to share with the group gathered there that morning.

Also as part of the service, we will have baskets with the individual church's names on them so that their members can drop off their weekly offering into their own church's basket. We will also have a separate basket for an MMA offering.



And as a special part of the service, we will be asking individuals to make/design peace flags that will display our prayers for hope and lift them up to God on the winds of the Spirit. If your church is not able to participate but would like to make a prayer flag, please feel free to do so. Please use blue, red, yellow, green, or white fabric, torn into 9x9 squares. (The colors represent the 5 elements of nature: water, fire, earth, air, sky).
