Play Ground Update!



Troop 40 Life Scout Thomie Wilson has been busy planning his Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project and getting all of the required approvals. On August 20th he met with Rev. McColl, Dan Roller and Phil Burchell to present his Preliminary Plan. Thomie will be leading his fellow scouts, scout leaders, family and friends on September 22nd (rain date is September 29th) to reclaim and renovate the playground at the rear of the Church. As you all know, this area has been abandoned for years and had become a roost for buzzards. This Eagle Scout Service Project will be phase one for this area.

Several months ago, Thomie brought to the Church's attention that the area could not be reclaimed unless it was sterilized properly, due to the hazards associated with the buzzard feces. The Church hired Evergreen AES Environmental Services to disinfect and clean the playground area. This took place on July 10th. Now that the area is safe, the rest of the plan can move forward.

The project will involve: trimming one tree and removing another (done by professional tree trimmers), planting one tree, removing most of the plastic play structures, removing 4 sunken tractor tires, repairing, painting and staining 2 swing sets, hanging new swings, removing a chain-link dog pen and cleaning the area - including removing 4 dead shrubs, refurbishing the wooden train play structure, cleaning out the existing storage shed, assembling 2 new picnic tables with benches, building and finishing corn hole game boards, trimming shrubs around the "cemetery," and adding new mulch over the entire area.

Anyone wishing to donate items toward Thomie's project can contact him at 859-227-9709. Toddler and baby swings (4 each) are needed, as well as a Thornless Honey Locust tree, 2 gallons of wood stain, 1 qt. white latex outdoor paint, and 1 qt. hunter green Rustoleum paint. If you would like to purchase the item and donate it you can, or you can make a donation and Thomie will purchase the item(s).

Thomie is the grandson of Pat Wilson and Betty Bright, and the son of Chuck and Pattie Wilson, and will be their fourth Eagle Scout!
