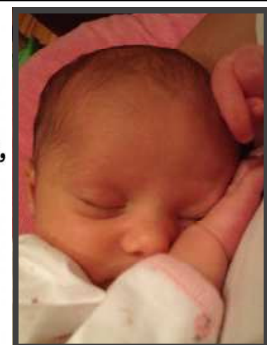

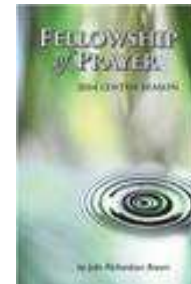
Lenten Devotional

Lenten Devotional

This year we will be using the Lenten Devotional from Chalice Press written by Julie Richardson Brown. Julie is the wife of former minister of Midway Christian Church, David Brown. They will be available for pick up in the narthex starting Sunday March 2nd.

Psalm 51:10 says, "Create in me a clean heart, O God." Isn't that what Lent does for us? In Fellowship of Prayer 2014 Julie Richardson Brown shows us how all days, not just those during Lent, are sacred opportunities for introspection and renewal."

Lenten Theme

“Satisfying Our Hunger for God”

Hunger motivates us. In both the physical and spiritual realms, our energies are often focused on satisfying our hungers, trying to satisfy the deep longing of our souls. And as we search for God, we certainly do experience moments of deep and profound happiness, but we quickly realize that these moments are temporary. We move on to the next dream, always hoping that the next dream, the next vision, will be the thing that makes us happy. So we hunger for love in our lives. We hunger for belonging. We hunger for accomplishment. We hunger for peace. We hunger for justice. We hunger for security. While each of these may offer us temporary happiness, the satisfaction is always short-lived. We still hunger for something more. We hunger for our God.

On our Lenten journey, we will be exploring the many ways that the Word of God tells us we can satisfy our hunger for God. The two Scriptures that will be our focus are Psalm 63 and John 6: 29-57, and as we continue our journey to satisfy our hunger, we will also learn that by getting in touch with our deepest desires and longings, getting in touch with our hunger for God, we will find the many places where God is already working in our lives.

To start our journey, I want to share two quotes with you:

“The soul must long for God in order to be set aflame by God’s love; but if the soul cannot yet feel this longing, then it must long for the longing. To long for the longing is also from God.” Meister Eckhart

“Man has an inborn hunger for God. He cannot be satisfied with anything less than God. God alone can supply the bread which satisfies the inner longing of your soul and the hunger of your heart.” Billy Graham

Lenten Mission Action

Many of the stories about Jesus involve gathering around food. Jesus lifted up bread and wine during the Passover feast as a remembrance of him and a blessing for us all. Jesus even tells us he is the Bread of Life. Food and gathering around the table are such a huge part of our identity as Disciples of Christ.

Realize that our spiritual hungers will never be satisfied as long as there is physical hunger in our world. As disciples of Christ who understand the importance of the table, we believe that a huge part of our hunger for God is also a hunger for justice and wholeness for all of God’s creation. So this Lenten season, we are taking up the challenge to address hunger issues in our community. We are doing this by learning more about organizations that help hungry families in our community and by inviting everyone to bring items for the Northside Backpack Project.

These backpacks are filled with items for meals and snacks that will last through the weekend. They are given to children on Friday afternoons as they leave school and then returned on Monday morning so that they can be refilled for the following week. Right now, the Northside Backpack Project feeds 50 children each week. And we are hearing more and more of how these backpacks are no longer just for the children. Many families are now relying on them to feed their family over the weekend as well.

So we are asking everyone during our Lenten journey to bring items for the Northside Backpack Project.

Shopping List: Oatmeal packets, cereal, granola bars, pudding cups, fruit cups, sandwich crackers, juice boxes, mac-n-cheese cups, beans-n-franks, chicken-n-dumplings, Hormel Compleats (less spicy ones), Chef-boy-ar-dee pasta, chili, ready to eat soups (chicken noodle or tomato), applesauce, and microwave popcorn.



Update on Cornerstone Campaign:

Back in the fall, it was decided to finish the tuck-pointing on the sanctuary building, which would be about \$60,000 for the total project. The trustees believed in the congregation so much that they decided to put forth the first \$25,000 for the project. So that left \$35,000. The Finance Committee approached the congregation of Midway Christian Church with a challenge: raise \$35,000 over twelve weeks for this project. At a luncheon on Sunday, October 27th, we celebrated that \$25,863.60 had been raised at that point! Wonderful News and it only gets better from there!



As of today, we have raised... \$56,364.60 for our Cornerstone Campaign! We are only \$3,635.40 from our goal! That is amazing!

And we are asking for one more final push! We are so close to our goal. The work is on schedule to start sometime in March, depending on weather, and we would like to have the full \$60,000 before the work gets started. So we are asking everyone to prayerfully consider making a gift to our Cornerstone campaign. Whether it is your first gift or second or third gift, all of it will be used to help ensure that our sanctuary building will continue for many more years to come to be a place of worship, a place where people can experience the love and grace of God, and more importantly, where we as part of the Body of Christ with Jesus as our Cornerstone can continue to carry out our mission of welcome.

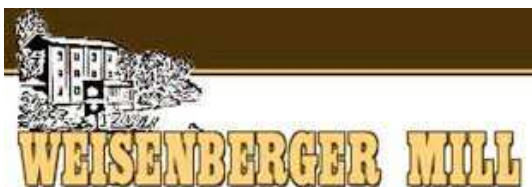

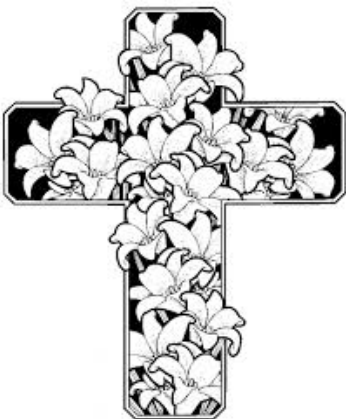
