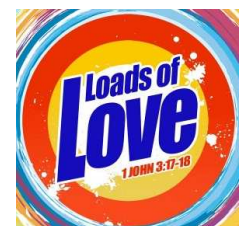

The main menu items for the September dinner are Bean Soup, Corn Muffins, and Spiced Cupcakes. Some ingredients we need donated are:

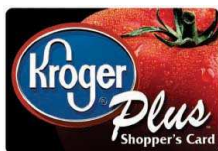

Gleaning for the Hungry

MCC Gleaning Dates @ Reed Valley Orchard:

- Monday, September 22nd
- Monday, October 6th (kids out of school)

Since 2010, Faith Feeds/GleanKY has collected over 81,814 pounds of food from Reed Valley Orchard and delivered it to about 44 different distribution points! Gleaning is easy and fun, especially at an orchard. In general, the process works as follows:

- Arrive at the orchard at the designated time. (Take empty boxes with you) FaithFeeds/GleanKY will have a supervisor at the site.
- Gather the fruit that is on the ground or otherwise designated for gleaning.
- Take the fruit to one of Lexington's hunger programs (the supervising volunteer will tell you where to deliver it).
- Get a feeling of great satisfaction!

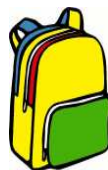
