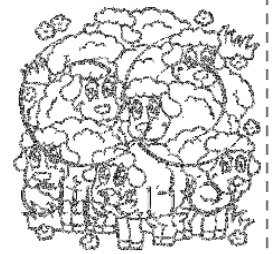

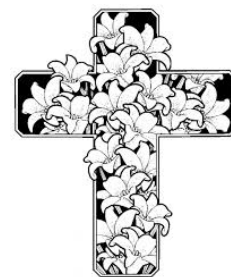

From the Trustees: Use of Endowment Fund - Proposal Deadline

Midway Christian is very fortunate to have a Mission Endowment Fund which was established in August of 2007 through the generous gift from Dorothy Gordon. As stated in the Mission Endowment Fund Policy, the primary purpose of the Fund is "to expand the witness and mission of Jesus Christ, serving human needs in our community and around the world." In keeping with this purpose, the policy allows an annual withdrawal for outreach-related improvements, equipment or programs. **Written requests from the congregation** (for outreach projects which are not already included in the church annual budget) for the Mission Endowment Fund **need to be submitted by April 1, 2016**. The requests will be reviewed by the Trustees who will make recommendations to the Midway Christian Church Board, which will have the final approval of the projects funded.



Refugee Kits



As part of our conversations through Food for the Soul, we have talked about how to welcome the stranger in our midst. The God moment came for us during these conversations when we learned that the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has requested to resettle 8% of ALL refugees who enter thru Church World Service offices. Due to multiple refugee crises in the world, there is an anticipated increased refugee arrivals throughout 2016. Requests have been sent out to create Welcome Kits for the newly-arrived families.

The first kit we will start collecting for is the Bath Kit. What is needed is:

- 2 bath towels/2 hand towels/2 wash cloths/1 bath mat
- 2 tooth brushes & toothpaste
- 2 Deodorant
- 6 bars soap
- Razor
- Toilet paper
- Shampoo/Conditioner
- Shower curtain/liner
- Trash can
- Toilet brush
- Feminine hygiene
- Ethnic lotions/vaseline

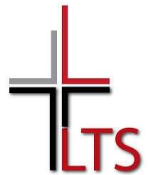
